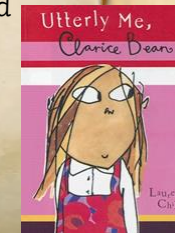

- Evaluating against the design brief.



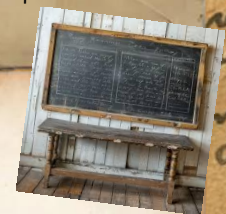
P.E
