MATHS

Place Value (within 50)

Count from 20 to 50. Count by making groups of tens. Groups of tens and ones. Partition into tens and ones. The number line to 50. Estimate on a number line to 50. 1 more, 1 less

Length and Height

Mass and Volume

COMPUTING

Technology Around Us

Defining and understanding what technology is. Children will relate this to school, home, outside and to its use in the wider world and learn about the safe use of technology devices.

Creating and Following Instructions

Foundational unit focused on understanding simple algorithms and algorithmic thinking. Children explore unplugged activities before moving to sequencing activities on digital devices. This unit introduces the basis of logical thinking in preparation for coding.
