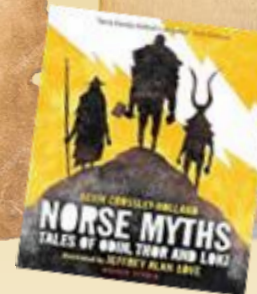

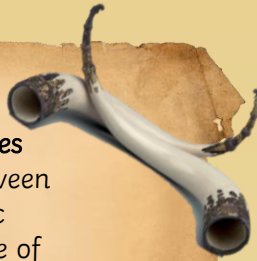
COMPUTING
