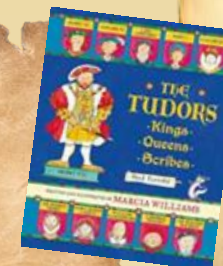

COMPUTING

Word Processing – Microsoft Word Desktop

This unit introduces children to word processing using the Desktop version of Microsoft Word. Children will explore how to edit, format and create their own documents.

Format text in a new Word document and then save. How to edit text and apply more advanced formatting. How to adjust the layout of a Word document. and insert and format images in Word. Use tables in Word to organise information. Combine Word skills to create and review a factsheet.

Electrical Systems: Wobble Bots

Investigate motors by creating circuits. Make a motorised product and test its function. Apply knowledge of circuits to experiment with product design. Design a motorised product for a specific purpose. Make and evaluate the effectiveness of a motorised product.
