

PE and Sport Premium Funding at Wincheap Foundation Primary School 2022 - 23



What is PE and Sport Premium Funding?

The PE and Sport Premium is additional funding for schools in England to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. PE and Sport premium spending should be prioritised in the following 5 key areas:

- increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- increase participation in competitive sport

PE and Sport Premium Funding at Wincheap

We use our PE and Sport Premium to contribute towards a range of sporting activities, resources, training and staffing. **All** pupils in the school, from the early years to Year 6, including those in the Speech and Language Department, benefit from high-quality PE teaching and sports provision in the school, led by an experienced PE leader and enhanced in recent years through an intense programme of bespoke Continuing Professional Development (CPD) and the employment of specialist coaches. Weekly PE lessons are currently taught by a specialist sports coach. A full-time qualified teacher is employed to provide forest school sessions for all classes, which increases our outdoor active learning and the amount of physical activity that pupils are engaged in.

Participation in sport is a very important part of our broad, balanced and engaging curriculum. Enhancing the quality and breadth of sports and physical activities available, combined with training opportunities for teachers and teaching assistants, has been a focus in recent years. The curriculum includes gymnastics, athletics and dance, as well as team games, and pupils have had the opportunity to join in exciting new sports and workshops in school. This has increased pupils' participation in extra-curricular sporting activities both in and out of school and helped to support school entry into local sports tournaments and competitions with other schools, for both boys and girls.

We aim to provide the best opportunities for pupils to develop their physical competence, confidence, and ability to perform in a range of activities. We teach awareness of the effect exercise has on their bodies and promote positive attitudes towards active and healthy lifestyles. The Daily Mile and 'Active 30' contribute to improving pupils' fitness further and encouraging them to be active on a daily basis during the school day. A variety of sports equipment is on offer for pupils to play with at play and lunch times enhancing opportunities for physical exercise.

We also use the funding to finance resources for PE lessons and extra-curricular sports clubs. We buy into a sport package with a local secondary school to provide staff training and access to tournaments with other local primary schools. We have used PE and Sport Premium funding to extend and diversify our extra-curricular offer to improve the wellbeing of less active children and particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds and vulnerable groups through funding of additional sports clubs, with the aim of further improving outcomes through better attendance and punctuality.

Swimming and the National Curriculum

At Wincheap, pupils in lower key stage 2 normally have a course of swimming lessons during the school year and a further course in the final term of Year 6 to ensure that by the end of Year 6 most are able to meet the requirements of the National Curriculum. Our Year 6 pupils also have daily swimming during our week-long residential adventurous activities week in September. This is subsidised by the school, partly from the PE and Sport Premium funding to enable access for all pupils. This provision was not possible in during and in the year following the COVID-19 pandemic, but will resume this school year.
